President Lee Hakel welcomed members to the 66th annual meeting of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green and called the meeting to order at 9:02 am. She thanked Flo Klopfenstein for catering the delicious breakfast. President Hakel appointed Joyce Kepke as the Parliamentarian and then Joyce declared a quorum was present. President Hakel asked to have the business meeting temporarily adjourned at 9:07am. Joyce Kepke made a motion for a temporary adjournment. Judy Knox seconded and it was accepted by voice vote. Vice President Ellen Dalton asked Scholarship Chair Ruth Ann Beaverson to introduce the 2018 winner of the LWVBG Joan Gordon Scholarship. Ruth Ann introduced Alexis Kisor and her mother Julie. Alexis will be attending Ohio State University majoring in Public Service. Alexis thanked the members for their support and shared that she had just returned from orientation at Ohio State. The speaker for the meeting was Judge Matt Reger. He talked about the dilemmas he faces as a judge dealing with the opioid epidemic. The business meeting was reconvened at 9:48am.

Secretary's Report: President Hakel asked for three volunteers for the Minutes Review Committee. Judy Knox, Joyce Kepke, and Lee McLaird volunteered and were appointed to the committee. Ellen Dalton moved to approve the minutes of the 2017 Annual Meeting as printed in the Annual Report. Jean Romans seconded the motion and it was approved by voice vote.

ByLaws Review and Revision: President Hakel thanked the ByLaws Review Committee for their hard work and asked Ellen Dalton, chair of the committee, to explain the revisions. Ellen asked the members to follow along with their handouts. In Article IV the sentence "Two of the ELECTED Directors shall be responsible for communication and development, respectively." was added. In Section V the wording "nominating committee chair, and nominating committee members" was added. In Section V the paragraph was changed to "The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all monies; shall be the custodian of these monies deposited in the bank designated by the Board of Directors; shall identify type of income deposited per the approved budget and pay and record budget expenses upon receipt of signed receipts or invoices; shall obtain approval from the Board of Directors prior to paying expenses not included in the adopted budget; shall complete a monthly reconciliation of all bank accounts and present monthly financial statements to the Board of Directors and an annual report to the Annual Meeting." Under Article VI a new Section 5 was added: "Financial Review Committee: The Board of Directors shall appoint a committee to review the prior year records no later than 60 days following the close of the fiscal year". Under Article VIII the word chairman was amended to chair and the phrase "at the first Board of Directors meeting following the annual election" was added. President Hakel asked for a motion to approve the revisions of the ByLaws and Roger Anderson so moved with Jean Roman seconding. It was passed by voice vote.

Treasurer's Report: Joan Callecod reviewed the Proposed Operating Budget for the fiscal year of July 1, 2018, to June 30, 2019. She explained that due to a successful finance drive the league was \$1,023 over what had been budgeted for 2017-2018. The net income as of May 29, 2018 was \$1, 915.61, however not all expenses are reflected as the fiscal year has not ended. The current balance of the Education Fund Budget is \$1490.50. The Joan Gordon Scholarship has \$2,194 on hand. The Comparative Balance Sheet shows assets of \$17,036.77. Joan explained to members how our dues are dispersed and the necessity to raise annual dues to \$60. Joan moved to accept the proposed budget and Roger Anderson seconded. It was accepted by voice vote.

Local Program: The following change was proposed for the committees: change Needs of the Elderly to Senior Concerns. Lee McLaird made a motion to readopt the previous positions and Janet Parks seconded. It was accepted by voice vote. A written report of each committee's activities for 2017-2018 was printed in the annual report.

Policies: The Non-Partisan Statement and the Diversity Policy printed in the Annual Report were reviewed by Ellen Dalton. Marcia Suter moved to readopt the policies and Lee McLaird seconded. They were readopted by voice vote.

Nominations: Marcia Suter presented the slate of nominees. She noted that Sheila Crowley will be added as a Director to fill a vacancy. Presented as the Nominating Committee's slate for two year terms (July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2020) are:

President Hakel asked for nominations from the floor. There were none. Janet Parks moved that the slate of nominated candidates be elected. Holly Myers seconded and the slate was accepted by voice vote.

Announcements: President Hakel again thanked Flo Klopfenstein for catering. She also thanked Todd Childers for designing the cover of the Annual Report and for all of his design expertise throughout the year. She thanked Ellen Dalton, as well, for compiling the information inside the report.

Adjournment: The meeting was adjourned by President Lee Hakel at 10:22 am.

Education (updated 2013)

The League supports high standards of education at all levels, including adequate and appropriate programs for the gifted and for students with special needs.

The League supports adequate and appropriate use of technology within all content areas at all levels.

The League supports the provision of vocational and technical education.

The League supports and promotes a balanced program of extracurricular activities at all levels.

The League supports sufficient funding for and accountability of programs and facilities at all levels.

Needs of the Elderly (updated 2005-2006)

League supports efforts to maintain or improve the quality of life of the elderly population in Wood County.

The needs of the elderly population in Wood County steadily increase due to longevity and the problems of health, finance and other difficulties that accompany longevity. On the other hand, financial support for services to the elderly by federal and state governments is not keeping up with inflation.

Land Use (updated 2005-2006)

In order to maintain the quality of life in our small city, our League continues to support careful long-range planning. Because change is occurring rapidly, we believe that the Bowling Green Comprehensive Plan needs to be kept current.

In addition, the League supports:

A. Top priority for the acquisition and maintenance of open space for public use.

B. Cooperation between governmental agents of the city of Bowling Green and the trustees of adjacent townships.

C. Public accessibility of the most recent version of the Comprehensive Plan, with any revisions dated and made evident.

D. Support of a precautionary moratorium on all new Concentrated Animal Feeding Operations (CAFOs) that produce untreated animal waste. Support of improved and similar waste water transportation and treatment systems on each CAFO site within Wood County as required by the State of Ohio of municipalities producing the same volume of waste, with safe nutrient management practices and disposal of sludge, in order to maintain adequate water quality standards in our aquifers, ground and surface waters.

Mental Health (updated 2016)

In order to maintain and enhance the quality of life in Bowling Green and Wood County, our League supports the continuing availability of mental health and substance abuse/addiction services for all.

We also support sufficient funding of mental health services, acknowledging the increasing influence of substance abuse/addictions on an individual's mental health.

To achieve the above our League supports:

- providing a wide range of effective services across the life span that employs practices informed by research, with flexibility to address changing needs;
- continuing the involvement of persons with mental illness and their family members in shaping services and policies;
- continuing collaboration among agencies including programming and funding;
- increasing public understanding of the impact of mental illness and substance abuse/addictions on the individual and the community.

POLICIES

Non-Partisan Policy Statement (Adopted February 2000; re-adopted 2018)

The Board of Directors of League of Women Voters Bowling Green may take action on governmental measures and policies in the public interest. However, it shall not support or oppose any party or candidate.

Board members shall not run for or hold partisan elective office. If a Board member declares for a partisan elective office, the member shall resign from the Board. Public notices released by the League announcing the resignation of a Board member to run for political office shall be carefully worded to avoid the appearance of endorsing the resigning Board member's candidacy.

Board members' activities must be limited to preserve the League's non-partisan position. The President and the Voter Service Chair shall not participate in any partisan way at any level.

A Board member may serve on any public board, commission, committee, or coalition. However that Board member does not represent the League unless officially designated as a League representative by the LWVBG Board.

A Board member may not speak or work against a League position in any way.

The political activities of a spouse or relative of a Board member are to be considered as separate and distinct from the activities of the Board member.

Diversity Policy (Adopted May 1998; re-adopted 2018)

The League of Women Voters of Bowling Green affirms its belief in, and commitment to, reflecting the diversity of the community in its membership, leadership, and programs.

BYLAWS

League of Women Voters of Bowling Green

As last amended 2018

ARTICLE I Name

Section 1. Name. The name of this organization shall be the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green, hereinafter referred to in these ByLaws as LWVBG or as the League. This local League is an integral part of the League of Women Voters of the United States, hereinafter referred to in these ByLaws as LWVUS, and of the League of Women Voters of Ohio.

ARTICLE II Purpose and Policy

Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green is to promote political responsibility through informed and active participation of citizens in government and to act on selected governmental issues.

Section 2. Political Policy. The League shall not support or oppose any political party or candidate.

ARTICLE III Membership

Section 1. Eligibility. Any person who subscribes to the purpose and policy of the League shall be eligible for membership.

A. Voting members. Citizens at least 18 years of age who join the League shall be voting members of the local and state Leagues of their place of joining and of LWVUS. Those who have been members of the League for 50 years or more shall be life members excused from payment of dues.

B. Associate members. All others who join the League shall be associate members, without voting privileges.

ARTICLE IV Board of Directors

Section 1. Number, Manner of Selection, and Term of Office. The Board of Directors shall consist of the officers

of the League, eight elected directors and not more than four appointed directors. Four of the elected directors shall be elected by the general membership at each Annual Meeting and shall serve for a term of two years, or until their successors have been elected and qualified. Two of the ELECTED Directors shall be responsible for communication and development, respectively. The elected members shall appoint such additional directors, not exceeding four, as they deem necessary to carry on the work of the League. The terms of office of the appointed directors shall be one year and shall expire June 30 following the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. Qualifications. Only voting members shall serve as officers or directors of this organization.

Section 3. Vacancies. Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors by reason of the resignation, death, or disqualification of an officer or elected member may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors until the next Annual Meeting. Three consecutive absences from a board meeting of any member without a valid reason shall be deemed a resignation.

Section 4. Powers and Duties. The Board of Directors shall have full charge of the property and business of the organization, with full power and authority to manage and conduct same, subject to the instructions of the general membership. It shall plan and direct the work necessary to carry out the program as adopted by the National Convention, the State Convention, and the Annual Meeting. The Board shall create and designate such special committees as it may deem necessary.

Section 5. Meetings. There shall be at least nine regular meetings of the Board of Directors annually. The President may call special meetings of the Board of Directors and shall call a special meeting upon the written request of five members of the Board.

Section 6. Quorum. A majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum.

Article V Officers

Section 1. Enumeration and Election of Officers. The officers of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green shall be a President, a Membership Vice President, a Program Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer who shall be elected for terms of two years by the general membership at an Annual Meeting and take office July 1. The President, the Membership Vice President, and the Secretary shall be elected in odd-numbered years. The Program Vice President and the Treasurer shall be elected in even-numbered years.

Section 2. The President. The President shall preside at all meetings of the organization and of the Board of Directors; may, in the absence or disability of the Treasurer, sign or endorse checks, drafts, and notes; shall be, ex officio, a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee; and shall have such usual powers of supervision and management as may pertain to the office of the President and perform such other duties as may be designated by the Board.

Section 3. The Vice Presidents. The Vice Presidents shall be responsible for membership and program, respectively, and other duties as assigned by the President or Board. At the first board meeting following the Annual Meeting, the Board of Directors shall designate the Program Vice President to serve as President if that office becomes vacant. If the Program Vice President is unable to serve, the Board shall designate the Membership Vice President. If the Membership Vice President is unable to serve in this capacity, the Board of Directors shall elect one of its elected Members, if possible, to fill the vacancy. If no current Board member is able to fulfill the position, a member shall be appointed provided that person has served at least one term on the Board.

Section 4. The Secretary. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of the League and of all meetings of the Board of Directors; shall notify all officers, directors and nominating committee chair and nominating committee members of their election; shall sign, with the President, all contracts and other instruments when so authorized by the Board and shall perform such other functions as may be incident to the office.

Section 5. The Treasurer. The Treasurer shall receive and disburse all monies; shall be the custodian of these monies deposited in the bank designated by the Board of Directors; shall identify type of income deposited per the approved budget and pay and record budget expenses upon receipt of signed receipts or invoices; shall obtain approval from the Board of Directors prior to paying expenses not included in the adopted budget; shall complete a monthly reconciliation of all bank accounts and present monthly financial statements to the Board of Directors and an annual report to the Annual Meeting.

ARTICLE VI Financial Administration

Section 1. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green shall commence on the

first day of July each year.

Section 2. Dues. Annual dues to be voted on at the Annual Meeting shall be payable by October 15. Any member who fails to pay dues within two months after they become payable shall be dropped from the membership rolls.

Section 3. Budget. A budget for the ensuing year shall be submitted by the Board of Directors to the Annual Meeting for adoption. The budget shall include support for the work of the League as a whole.

Section 4. Budget Committee. A Budget Committee shall be appointed by the Board of Directors at least two months prior to the Annual Meeting to prepare a budget for the ensuing year. The proposed budget shall be sent to all members one month before the Annual Meeting. The Treasurer shall be a member, but not eligible to chair the committee.

Section 5. Financial Review Committee. The Board of Directors shall appoint a committee to review the prior year financial records no later than 60 days following the close of the fiscal year.

Section 6. Disbandment. In case of disbandment of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green, all monies and securities shall be transferred to the "Marilyn Singleton Memorial Fund" at Bowling Green High School; should that fund not be in existence, then to the League Of Women Voters of Perrysburg Area. All other property or whatsoever nature, whether real, personal, or mixed, which may at the time be owned by or under the control of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green shall be disposed of by any officer of the organization, or corporation for such public, charitable, or educational uses and purposes as may be designated by the Board of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green.

ARTICLE VII Meetings

Section 1. Membership Meetings. There shall be at least three meetings of the membership each year. Time and place shall be determined by the Board of Directors

Section 2. Annual Meeting. An Annual Meeting shall be held before the end of the fiscal year, the exact date to be determined by the Board of Directors. The Annual Meeting shall

- a. adopt a local program for the ensuing year;
- b. elect officers, directors, and three members of the nominating committee;
- c. adopt an adequate budget;
- d. transact such other business as may properly come before it;

Section 3. Quorum. Twenty percent of the members of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green shall constitute a quorum at all business meetings when a vote is taken.

ARTICLE VIII Nominations and Elections

Section 1. Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members: the chairman and two members elected at the Annual Meeting, and two board members appointed by a newly elected Board of Directors.

Section 2. Report of the Nominating Committee and Nominations from the Floor. The report of the Nominating Committee shall be sent to all members one month before the Annual Meeting. Immediately following the report of the Nominating Committee at the Annual Meeting, nominations may be made from the floor by any voting member provided the consent of the nominee has been secured.

Section 3. Elections. The election shall be by ballot, provided that when there is but one nominee for each office, the Secretary may be instructed to cast the ballot for every nominee. The majority vote of those qualified to vote and voting shall constitute an election. Absentee or proxy voting shall not be permitted.

ARTICLE IX Program

Section 1. Authorization. The governmental principles adopted by the National Convention, and supported by the League as a whole, constitute the authorization for the adoption of the program.

Section 2. Program. The program of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green shall consist of

- a. action to implement the principles of the League of Women Voters of the United States and the League of Women Voters of Ohio and
- b. those local issues chosen for concerted study and action.

Section 3. Current Agenda and Continuing Responsibilities. These categories of program are defined as follows:

- a. The current agenda shall consist of those local governmental issues that the membership shall choose for

sustained attention and concerted action.

b. The continuing responsibilities shall consist of positions on local governmental issues to which the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green has given sustained attention and on which it may continue to act.

Section 4. Action by the Annual Meeting. The Annual Meeting shall act upon the program using the following procedures:

- a. The Board of Directors shall consider the recommendations sent in by the voting members two months prior to the Annual Meeting and shall formulate a proposed program.
- b. The proposed program shall be sent to all members one month before the Annual Meeting.
- c. A majority vote of voting members present and voting at the Annual Meeting shall be required for adoption of subjects in the proposed program as presented to the Annual Meeting by the Board of Directors.
- d. Recommendations for program submitted by voting members two months prior to the Annual Meeting but not recommended by the Board of Directors may be considered by the Annual Meeting provided that:
 1. The Annual Meeting shall order consideration by a majority vote and
 2. The Annual Meeting shall adopt the item by a majority vote.
- e. Changes in the program, in the case of altered conditions, may be made, provided that information concerning the proposed changes has been sent to all members at least two weeks prior to a general membership meeting at which the change is to be discussed and final action taken.

Section 5. Member Action. Members may act in the name of the League of Women Voters only when authorized to do so by the appropriate Board of Directors.

ARTICLE X National Convention, State Convention and Council

Section 1. National Convention. The Board of Directors at a meeting before the date on which the names of delegates must be sent to the national office shall select delegates to that convention in the number allotted the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green under the provisions of the ByLaws of the League of Women Voters of the United States.

Section 2. State Convention. The Board of Directors at a meeting before the date on which the names of delegates must be sent to the state office shall select delegates to that convention in the number allotted the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green under the provisions of the ByLaws of the League of Women Voters of Ohio.

Section 3. State Council. The Board of Directors at a meeting before the date on which the names of delegates must be sent to the state office shall select delegates to that council in the number allotted the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green under the provisions of the ByLaws of the League of Women Voters of Ohio.

ARTICLE XI Parliamentary Authority

Section 1. Parliamentary Authority. The rules contained in the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall govern the organization in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these ByLaws.

ARTICLE XII Amendments

Section 1. Amendments. These ByLaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present and voting at the Annual Meeting, provided the amendments were submitted to the membership in writing at least one month in advance of the meeting. □

LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS OF BOWLING GREEN ACTIVITIES for 2018-19

PRESIDENT—Lee HakeI

Looking back over the activities of the last year, I marvel that such a small number of people accomplished so much. I credit our effectiveness to our energy, our determination, our commitment and our collective intelligence.

Topping the list of accomplishments this year is our participation in the statewide effort against gerrymandering. We knew that the partisan drawing of political districts is wrong and now the voters and the courts agree. Just in May, the Appeals Court ruled in our favor. ACLU provided the lawyers, but it was the League who led the fight and League

members who gave decisive testimony. Ohio must now redraw district lines in time for the November 2019 election. This decision may be appealed.

We offered interesting and helpful programs to our members and to the public on September 25th (The Mental Health of Children Education Night), October 7th (Candidate's Forum), October 13th (Meet Jen Miller, new LWVO Executive Director), October 27 (End of Life Issues), November 29th (Census Counts), March 21st (Gotta Run [for elected office]), and April 2nd (Our Health and the Health of the Great Lakes). That is a remarkable seven public informational meetings in eight months!

We have increased our visibility in print thanks to Todd Childer's wonderful redesign of our Annual Report, our Guide to Public Officials, and our new Membership brochure. Our electronic presence was greatly enhanced by Denise Zephier's work on our website, and Tonya Eiden's work on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram. Marilyn Levinson documents everything we do with her excellent photographs.

This has been a very difficult year for the Bowling Green Board of Education. They have been attacked and intimidated by a small, but very vocal group of people. I'm proud to say that for the last five months between 5 and 9 League members have attended each School Board meeting. I can't claim the vitriol has stopped, but meetings have been civil since we started attending. And the School Board and administrators have been grateful.

Also, related to education, we took a stand against high stakes testing by concurring with the Greater Cleveland and Pennsylvania Leagues. Because they did the study, we were able to take a position without doing our own study. And at the state convention in May 2019, the entire Ohio League of Women Voters concurred.

Working with other Leagues, we attended both Statehouse Day, to lobby on our positions, and the LWVOhio state convention. We have also begun to work more closely with the Toledo-Lucas County and Perrysburg Leagues. The three Leagues are especially interested in working together on plans for our great celebration in 2020: 100 years of enfranchisement of women. It took nearly 100 years to get the vote for women, but we have it because those who came before us never gave up. And that should be our mantra as we go forward.

Here's to working to make democracy work for the next 100 years; one volunteer hour, one study, one program, one meeting at a time. □

Meeting twice in early summer, the committee planned the Candidates Forum and wrote questions for the Fall candidates. Candidates were reached by email for all communication. The members kept in contact with candidates, organized the candidate Voter Guide and submitted the document to the *Sentinel-Tribune*. In addition, a member wrote three election information columns for the paper. A training registration session was held for BGSU students.

The 2018 Candidates Forum was held this year on October 7 in Perrysburg at the Perrysburg French Quarter, following our custom of changing locations every other even-numbered year. 190 people attended. Several LWVBG members worked the Forum. New in very many years, several candidates for Ohio State Board of Education attended, providing some lively observations. After a great deal of summer planning, working with the BG Middle School Counselors and NAMI, the committee put together a Resource Fair, held on September 25, of 12 of the area Mental Health agencies who would be helpful to parents if they had family mental health issues. LWV BG member Maria Simon was also present with books for adults and children dealing with Mental Health. NAMI and the Counselors planned a panel presentation. The evening was very successful, although we all wished for a higher attendance.

Our next venture was a visit to the Connection Center at its new location on South Main. We toured the much larger facility which better accommodates “a community of people with shared mental and/or physical health and substance disorder struggles working together to achieve their full potential”. The manager, Verna Mullins Henry provided us with a great deal of information about the activities and programming which its members take part in planning and executing.

We then had two meetings in December and January to decide our new direction. We were pleased to have one new member, Jane Robb, and decided to pursue our interest in Suicide Prevention both in the schools and in Wood County in general. We asked Angie Patchen from the Wood County Suicide Prevention Coalition to meet with us and help us understand the overall picture and to help us figure out how best to educate ourselves and others about this increasingly important topic. We met with her on March 19, 2019 and learned that the Coalition Board is made up of representatives from most of the MH Agencies in the County and they work together to promote awareness and prevention of suicide. They provide numerous training programs for teachers and others throughout the area and hope to help teachers and others to be aware of the signs of suicide and assess risk for suicide or mental health problems in general. They also produced 30 second Public Service announcements which aired in March and April, having also aired these at holiday time in December.

As we close out our LWV BG year, we will meet with Ann Huss from Children’s Resource Center Tuesday, May 21, 2019. She will discuss Suicide Prevention programs she presents in the schools and bring us up to date on the latest suicide statistics. Two members, Jane Robb and Char Scherer, attended the program for parents that BG City Schools provided following the BGHS student suicide. Ann Huss and Noelle Duvall presented the information at that very informative meeting. □

To the editor:

The Mental Health Committee of the League of Women Voters of Bowling Green urges a positive vote for the Alcohol, Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services Board's levy. This 1.0 mill, 10-year replacement levy will provide funding for just over one-third of the costs of the county's mental health and addiction services, about \$3.26 million a year. A replacement levy is not a new tax. It keeps the millage the same, but uses current property values. The levy will cost \$35 per \$100,000 home valuation. This is about an \$8.60 increase yearly to the home owner.

The ADAMHS Board is comprised of 18 volunteer Wood County community members, bringing with them a variety of expertise and experience. The board operations are conducted by the executive director and six staff. The board assesses the county's mental health and substance abuse problems and plans for cost effective services to address them. It then contracts with certified community agencies to provide programs and therapies and monitors and evaluates these services. It raises funds through levies and grants.

Mental health and addiction services and programs include treatment and supports for recovery, crisis response and intervention services, the latter working closely with law enforcement. The ADAMHS Board funds agencies' nationally recognized community education and prevention programs, including those aimed at the rising opiate epidemic and

the increasing number of suicides in Wood County.

Services reach all ages of Wood County residents. Some agencies receiving program funding include: the Children's Resource Center, Harbor Wood Co., Unison Health, Zepf Center, Lutheran Social Services and A Renewed Mind. The ADAMHS Board also contracts with three hospitals that provide inpatient psychiatric services.

This levy is a good investment in the lives of people dealing with difficult problems. Helping them and their families helps make stronger communities for all of us.
